Sunday School Pre-Nursery Class (2014)

The Pre-Nursery Class is meant for the little ones aged 18 months-3 years old. Every Sunday, we meet in FEK Room 1 (the room with the Green doors). The Sunday School lesson is divided into four parts:

9.30-9.50am: Playtime on the mat. When playtime is up, the children must help to keep the toys too.

9.50-10.05am: Singspiration. Occasionally, the children are encouraged to request their favourite songs.

10.05-10.20am: Bible story time.

10.20-10.30am: Worksheet time. Children are given a worksheet to help reinforce the Bible story they have just heard.

10.30am: Dismissal.

Through the years in Pre-Nursery Class, we have had

the privilege of watching many children grow and mature. The same can be said of some of the teachers who have helped since they were teenagers. The older teachers have seen these young sisters grow and graduate, work and even get married. Though their title is officially changed from 'Miss' to 'Mrs', they continue to be addressed as 'Jie Jie' by the little ones in class.

One of these perpetual 'Jie Jies' is Mrs Grace Tay (spouse of Dr Ian Tay). Here's her sharing about serving in Pre-Nursery class:

I joined the Pre-Nursery Sunday school about eight years ago. At the time, I had just finished my A levels, and helped out at the Sunday School together with some friends around my age. Initially, I had great fears and uncertainty about how to interact with the children, many of whom could not even communicate in full sentences. In fact, the hardest part was learning how to play with the children during the first 15 minutes of playtime, especially because the last time I had played with toys was almost 10 years ago, when I was a kid myself!

Nevertheless, the Lord taught me much through this ministry. I realised that playtime can be one of the most important components of the class. As we encourage the toddlers to share their toys, it becomes an opportunity for them to put into practice what they learn about God's love. It is also a chance for us to get to know them better.

I have learnt much from many of the more experienced teachers, who have been able to convey the Bible story in plain, simple and yet engaging terms to the children. It is a real blessing to see how most of the children are eager to learn and to sing songs during worship. Although sometimes they cannot remember how the Bible story goes the following week, many of the parents will also remind their children about what they had learnt in

Sunday school. In time to come, they not only remember the story, but are able to participate actively in class. Indeed, our prayer is that, having grown up in a covenant family, the children will grow up into godly men and women.

Romans 8:29a "For whom he did foreknew he also did pre-destinate to be conformed to the image of the son." This is true for me. I was a very negative uncaring child-even at a young age. I grew up in a superstitious household-dragons, lucky calendars, Buddha heads, ZODIAC symbols. I felt this had a lot to do with my negativity. The Vietnamese also believe in worshipping ancestors. I remember thinking-who am I suppose to pray for or to? I will pray to Jesus instead of my Grandfather- who has already passed away. We had left Vietnam one evening-everything. "Tonight, we must go. We must travel lightly," my father had said to my mother. Except for a few family tokens—remembrances of a lifetime ago, my parents had left country, house, family...EVERYTHING. They had the clothes on their backs and their children. My father paid someone for a boat. I wondered how my Dad had such foresight and courage to leave everything for his young family with only a word-not even promise of a better tomorrow. His friends had talked. "Vietnam will fall soon." I was only a year old and my sister three. You may wonder how God can bring

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something beautiful out of war-the sacrifice of a country-of a man to his family. God slowly didin His manifold wisdom-God did. I am reminded of the story of Joseph and how God used brothers' hatred and enslavement to preserve life. Genesis 45:6We had been sponsored to Hot Springs, AR. My dad was an artist and a man hired him to be a potter. It was during Vacation Bible School at Grand Avenue Baptist Church. It was summertime and we were just playing at my sister's friend's house. I had lots of fun listening to Bible stories, singing

songs, and bible crafts. Then, my sister and I began going to church regularly over the course of 2-3 years. The Holy Spirit worked a good work in our hearts. I am sure now that the Sunday School teachers and church staff prayed for my sister and me-amongst others to know Christ. My sister took the Lord as her saviour first. I had asked what happened in the private room where the church leaders talked with you about accepting Christ. My sister said there was nothing to be afraid of. The following Sunday, I didn't hesitate at invitation time. I bounced up there and took Jesus as my Lord and saviour.
