We seek to study the books of the Bible deeply together, chapter-by-chapter, verse-by-verse. All six classes are studying the same book, and we are covering at the same pace.

Bible Study:

May to Jul: James

Aug to Nov: Genesis 1-12

Teachers Prep Class:

To better equip ourselves, the teachers of all classes also gather on every Thursday night over Zoom to prepare by discussing and reviewing the coming week lessons. This is important as we mutually sharpen and encourage one another. For me, these sessions have personally been a great learning.

Circuit Breaker Zoom:

During this period of COVID-19 circuit breaker, thank God for enabling us to continue classes over Zoom. Even though we lost the face-to-face interaction, we continue to reach out to our class each week.
