Evangelism Survey 2025

Life BP Church

Summary of findings

1. Lifers are **generally motivated** to share the gospel but feel **relatively less equipped** to evangelise
2. Top challenges faced include: (1) fear of ruining relationships, (2) fear of rejection / ridicule, and (3) unsure of how to start a conversation on Christianity naturally
3. Top 5 themes from suggestions provided by members:
 - a. Provide practical, scenario-based training and workshops on evangelism.
 - b. Ensure church leaders actively participate in and model evangelism.
 - c. Adopt creative and context-sensitive outreach methods tailored to different groups.
 - d. Develop and distribute clear, multilingual resources and guides for evangelism.
 - e. Offer regular encouragement, reminders, and visible support for evangelism efforts.

Detailed summary of suggestions from members (1/2)

The common themes in the suggestions for how the church can better encourage or equip its members to evangelise are:

1. Practical Training and Workshops
 - a. Many respondents requested hands-on, practical training on how to share the gospel, including workshops, seminars, and real-life scenario practice. Suggestions included providing courses that address common objections, role-playing different situations, and practicing evangelism in small groups or fellowship settings. There were also calls for a short class or a small guidebook on evangelism to offer step-by-step help.
2. Leadership Involvement and Example
 - a. Several comments highlighted the importance of church leaders (pastors, elders, deacons) actively participating in evangelism and leading by example. Members felt more encouraged when leaders joined outreach efforts and demonstrated commitment to the Great Commission. Some noted a lack of encouragement or visible involvement from leadership as a discouragement.

Detailed summary of suggestions from members (2/2)

3. Contextual and Creative Approaches

- a. Respondents suggested using creative outreach methods such as art, music, sports, meals, and community services to connect with different groups. There was also emphasis on tailoring evangelism to specific audiences (e.g., using different languages, addressing unique cultural needs, or providing materials in Mandarin).

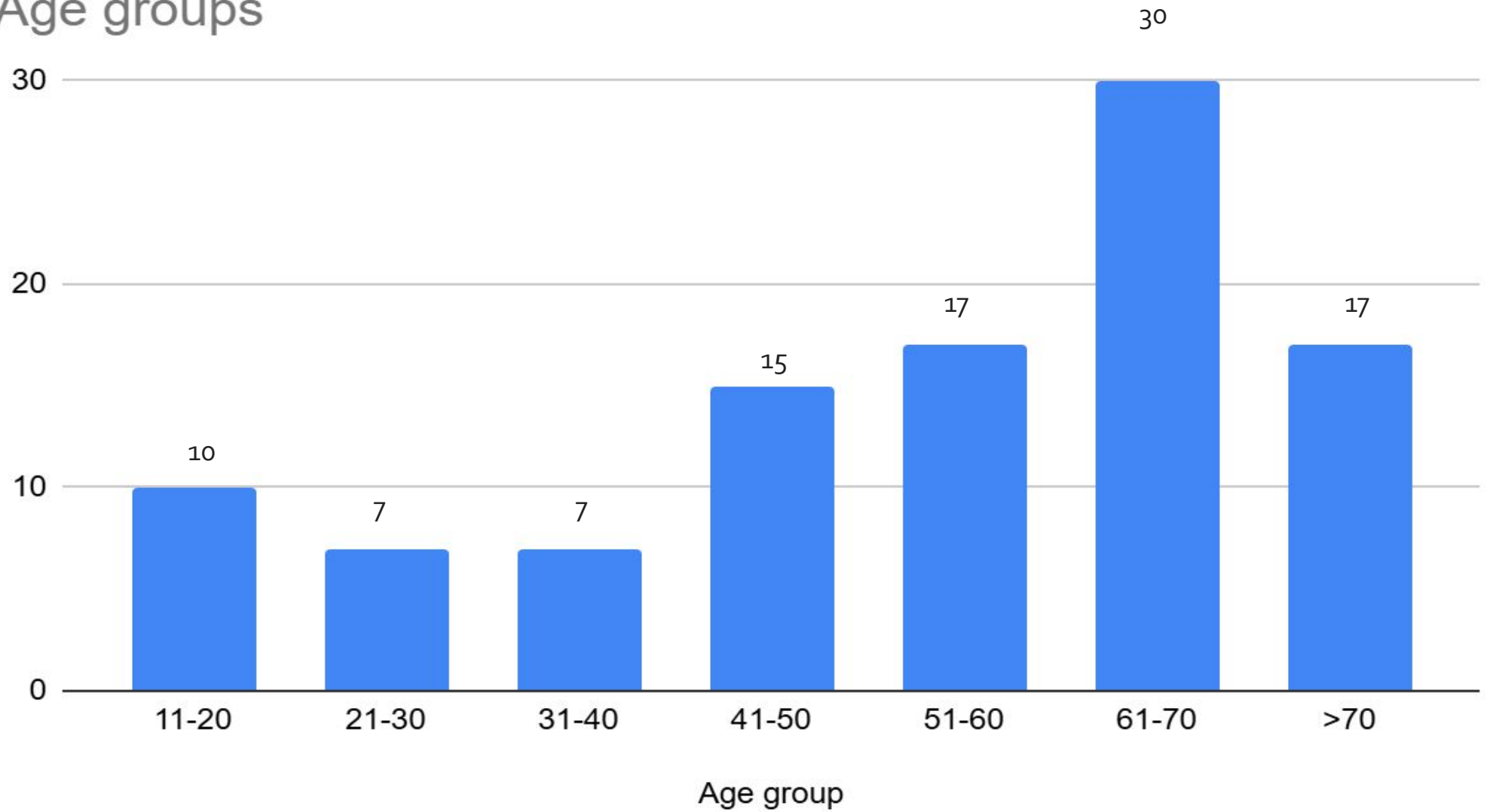
4. Resources and Materials

- a. There were multiple requests for evangelism resources: glossaries of Christian terms in various languages, apologetics lessons, Bible study materials, and practical guides. Members wanted materials that help them handle tough questions and present the gospel clearly, especially to those with different backgrounds or objections.

5. Ongoing Encouragement and Reminders

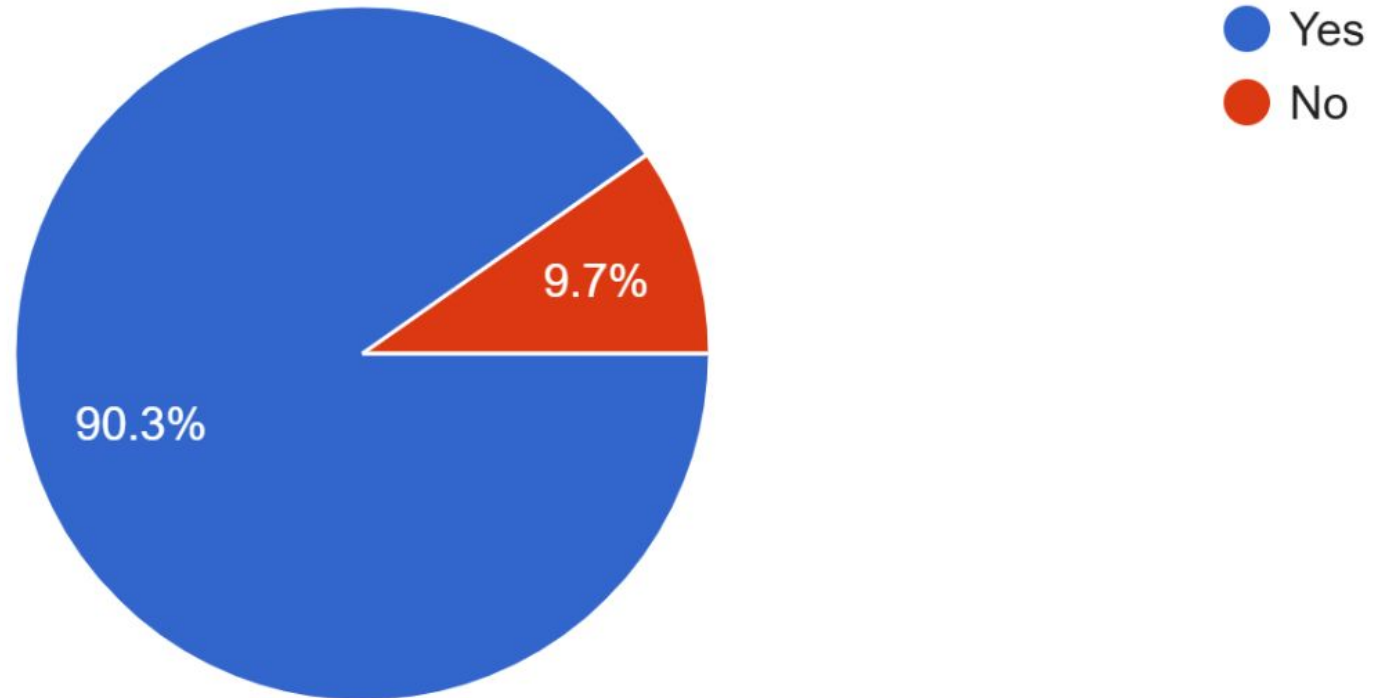
- a. Members felt that regular encouragement and reminders about evangelism from the pulpit and within fellowship groups would help keep evangelism a priority. Some suggested that the church should frequently mention evangelism in messages and provide motivation for members to get involved.

Age groups

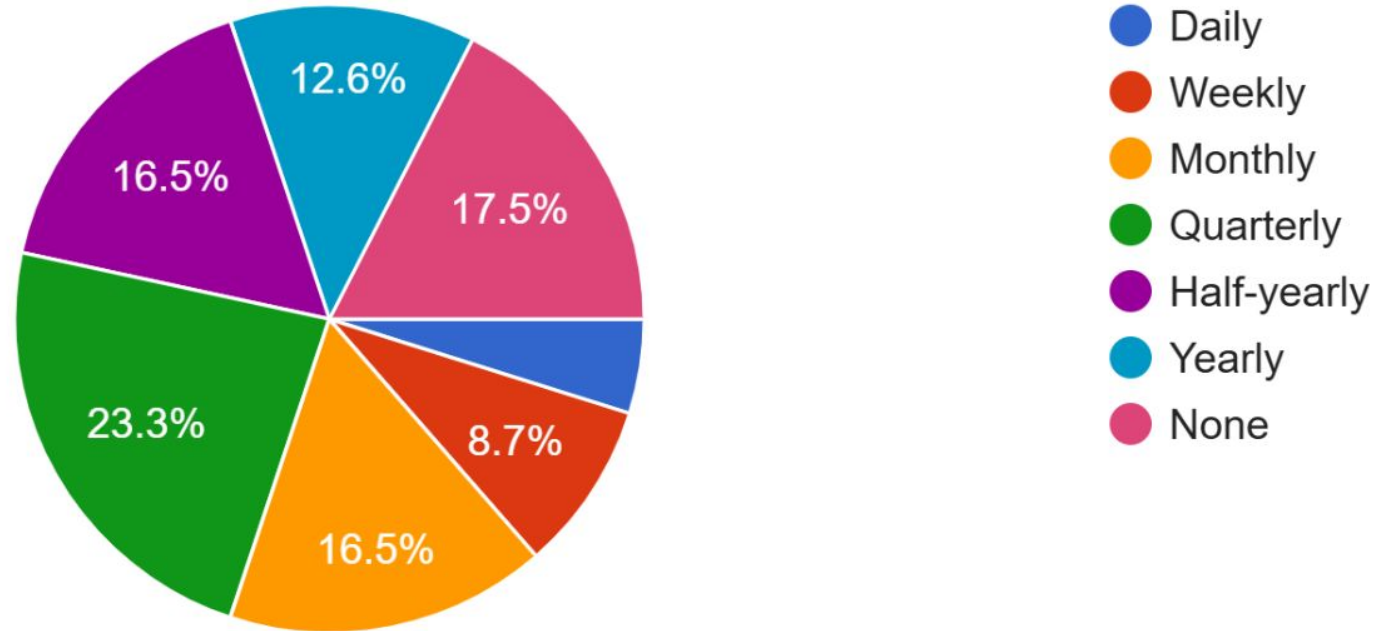


Have you shared the gospel before?

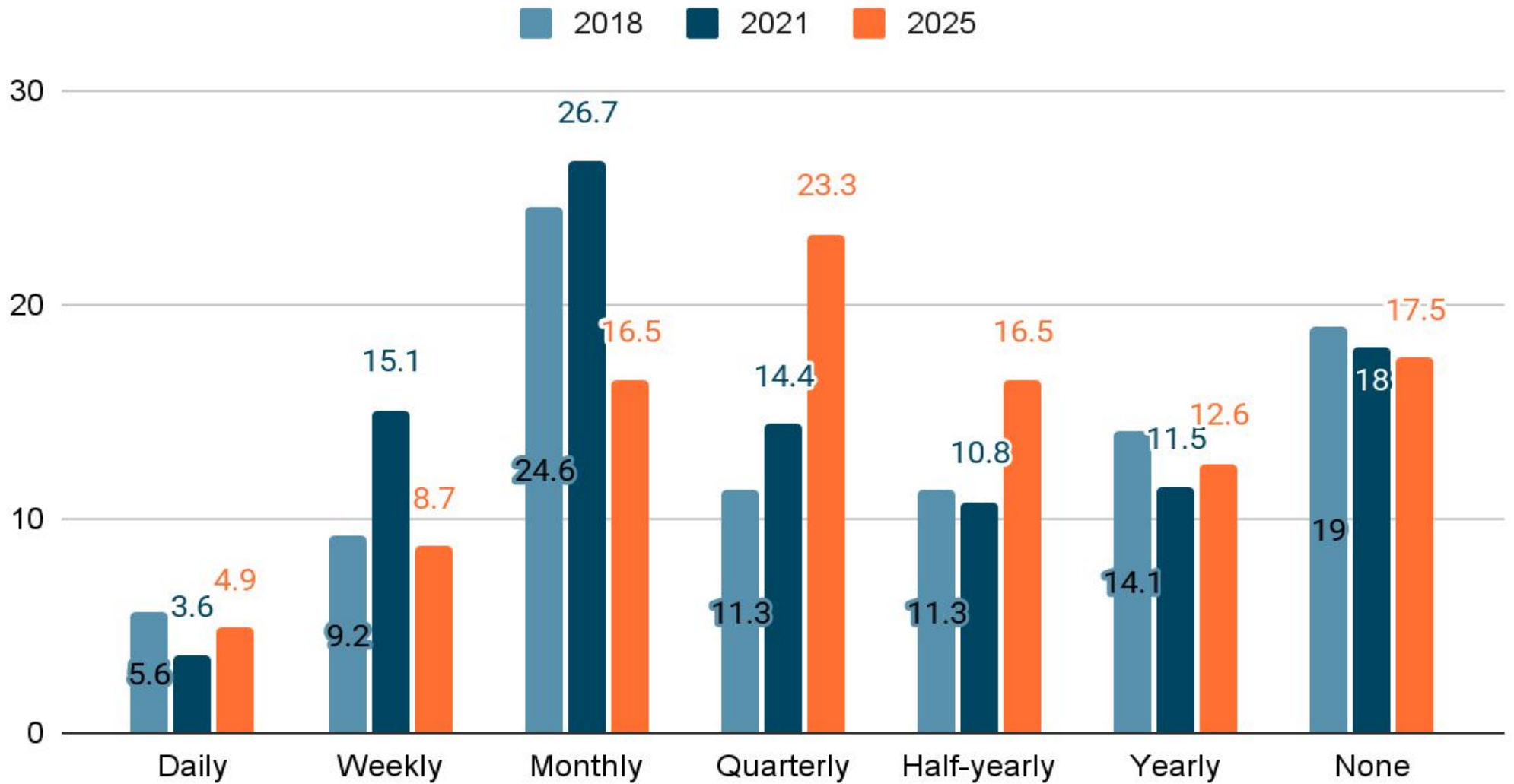

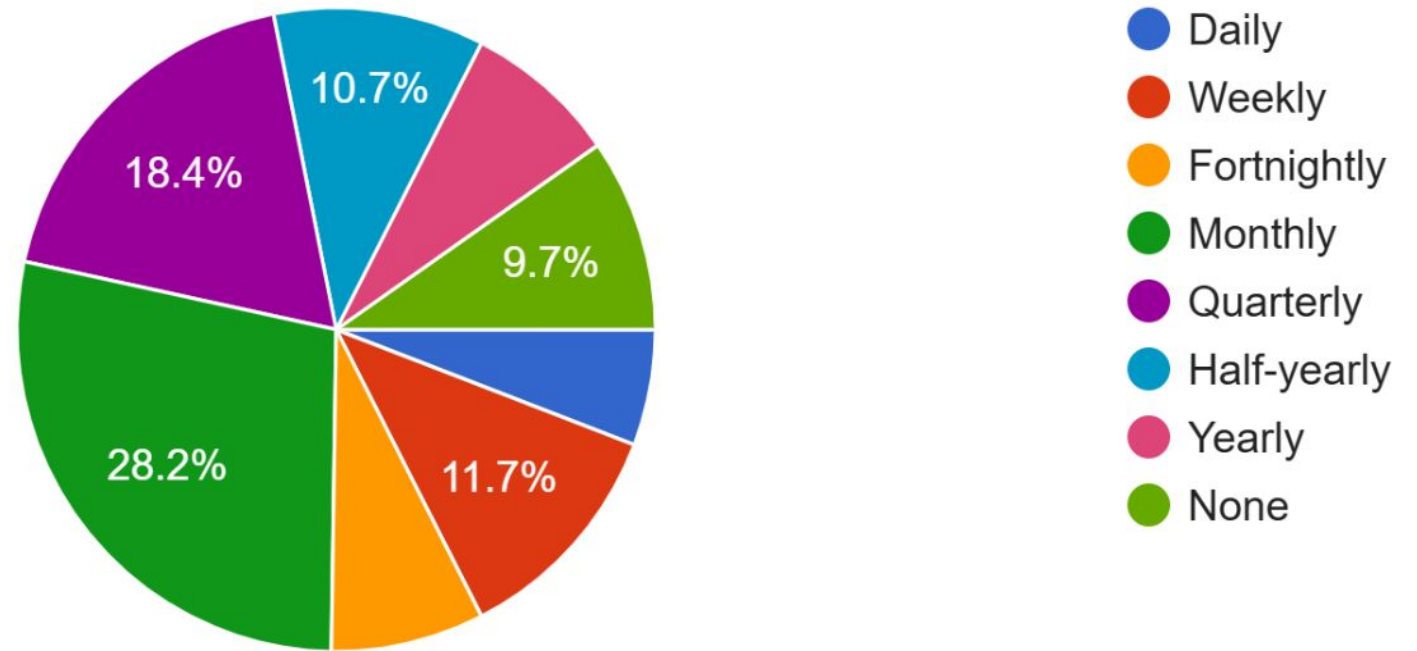


Average frequency of witnessing to non-believers (in the past 12 months) (%)



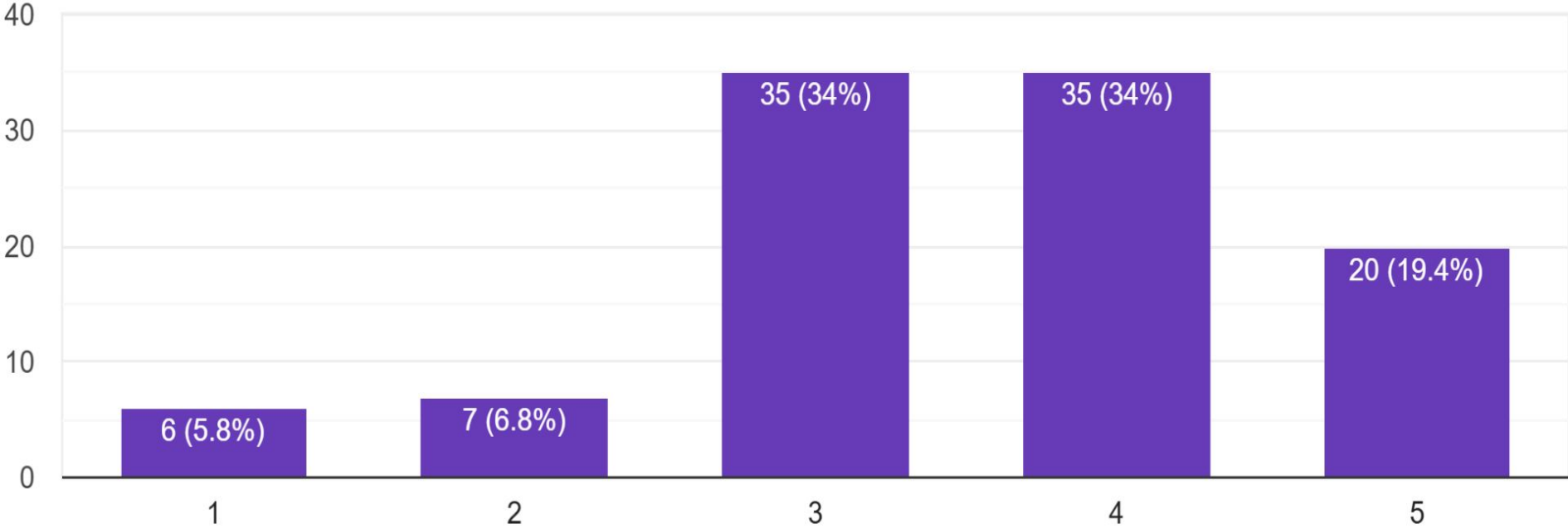
I plan/intend to witness to non-believers (over the next 12 months):

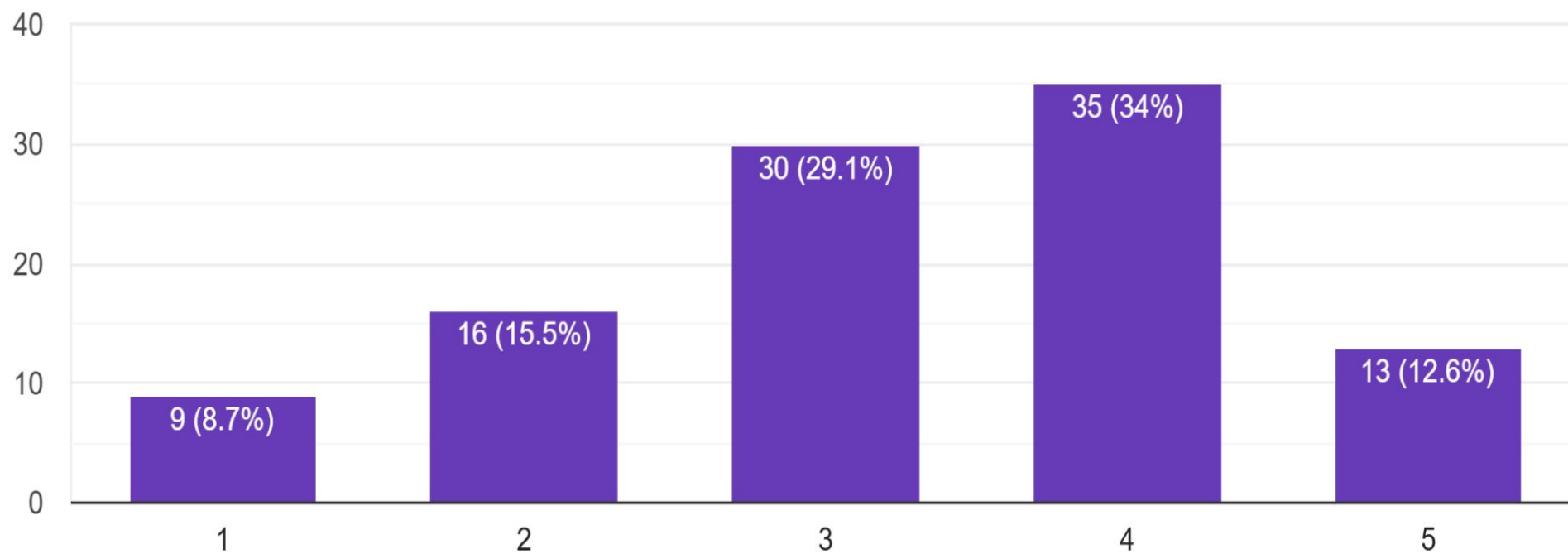
On a scale of 1 to 5, how motivated are you to share the gospel?



A informal but structured DIY on how to evangelise to family, friends, strangers

After conversion support and follow up with new believers

All leaders to be trained and practice the Great Commission, become exemplary to members

Can be more creative. Use art, music learning and jamming, calligraphy, exercise, sports - basketball, pickeball,...manga games,...English classes for foreigners/workers.....meals reachout to the less priviledged at site....or free lunch distribution at church premises on weekends....reachout to refugees housed in Malaysia, elsewhere....use all multi and social media, SW radio,...provide financial benevolence to refugees in war zones with the gospel, open Gospel outreach to Japan - liberal visa application for preachers/gospel workers, push the border

Lessons in Apologetics

Mainly, there are no commonly known avenues in church to refer ad hoc, new believers, for discipleship at a one to one or small group level

"Very little encouragement/motivation from LBPC leadership to evangelize. Hardly any material is provided. Certain lessons/instructions can be provided for those moved to evangelize. .

CHURCH LEADERS TALK ABOUT EVANGELISM BUT THEMSELVES ARE NOT INVOLVED OR NOT EXAMPLES. This greatly discouraged me and other church members."

Go overseas & identify a more productive & receptive target group to share the Gospel.

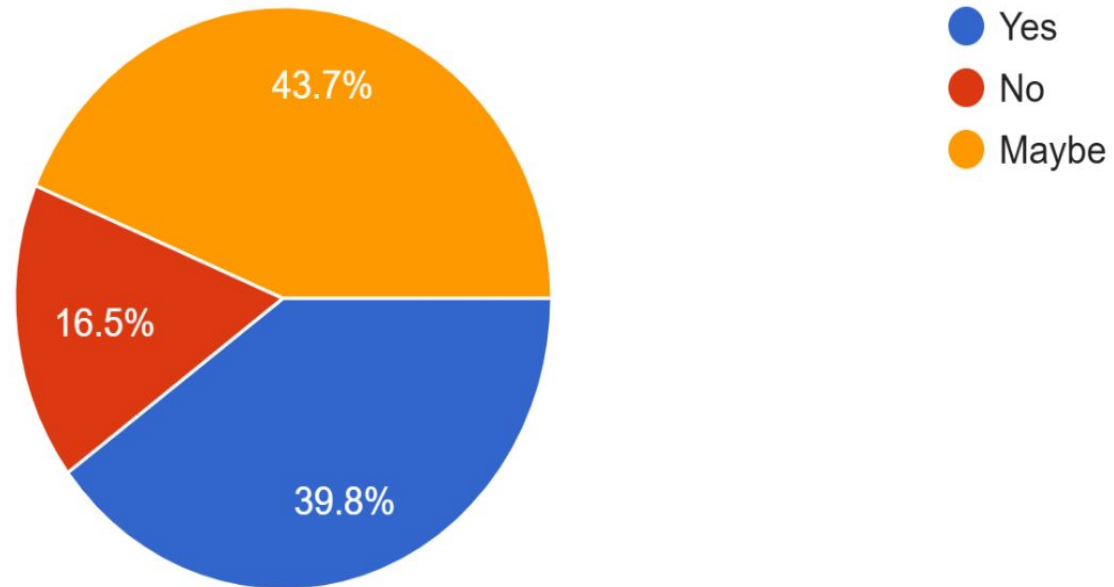
